Geography Major Requirements

The Geography major requires a minimum of 46 credits in Geography (or specifically noted Environmental Studies, Ethnic Studies, or Asian Studies) courses. The major requires 3 Introductory Core courses (12 credits) and 2 Advanced Core courses (8 credits) to provide the foundational knowledge of the discipline. 3 breadth Courses (12 credits) from across human geography, biophysical geography and GIScience are required, and 3 elective courses are required in a chosen Geography Concentration (12 credits). All students are required to take at least 1 course (2 credits) from the Launchpad.

At least 9 Geography courses must be taken for a letter grade. A grade of C- or better is required for any course applied towards the major, and a GPA of 2.25 or better is required in courses used to fulfill the major.
