LATINX STUDIES MINOR REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST

Requirements

The minor will require 24 total credits, of which at least 12 must be in upper-division courses. All 12 upper-division credits must be taken in residence. Some experimental courses can count toward the minor as electives, but the minor can be completed without any experimental courses. The minor will have no restrictions on overlap in coursework that counts both toward the minor and some other credential a student might be earning.

At least 16 credits must be completed for a letter grade and passed with a mid-C or better to count toward the minor.
